The FLUVANNA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE, LAKE MONTICELLO POLICE

DEPARTMENT and **ALLIED UNIVERSAL SECURITY SERVICES** continue to work in tandem to provide round-the-clock police coverage, facility security, and access control.

LMOA staff, the Young Residents and Families Committee, and the Lake Monticello Beautification Corps collaborated with the Fluvanna County High School's STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION to provide the community with volunteers on three occasions.

LMOA utilized postcards with QR codes and a digital voting platform instead of the traditional paper packets, saving thousands of dollars on printing and postage. This method was widely embraced by our Members. LMOA still supported individuals who preferred paper voting. We saw normal numbers of participation but only 63 paper votes!

OUR LAKE

Our lake health partners at SOLitude reported that, under normal circumstances, Lake Monticello is one of the cleanest swimming lakes in Virginia! This fantastic news was overshadowed by numerous sewage leaks that temporarily contaminated our Lake with E. coli. The Board spoke out against Aqua Virginia's negligence, seeking support from DEQ, the County, and the Health Department. The dangers of E. coli and the odor coming from the treatment plant threaten the well-being of Lake Monticello's residents. Our community will continue to work together to protect the health of our people and our Lake.

UNPRECEDENTED VOTER TURNOUT

The 2023 Special Meeting of LMOA Members produced a historical voter turnout with more than half of the membership making their voices heard. During the Special Election period, Board meetings and special meetings were well-attended by LMOA Members who utilized their right to speak out.
