CHAPTER SIX - Section 6.08 TENNIS AND BASKETBALL COURTS

Adopted: March 30, 2005 Amended: September 24, 2009 Amended: January 23, 2014

I. POLICY

The following is the policy with respect to the use of LMOA tennis and basketball courts:

- A. The Lafayette and Ashlawn basketball courts and the Lafayette tennis courts are open for play without charge to members, Social Associate members and their guests.
- B. The Ashlawn tennis courts are open to tennis members and tennis day use players for a fee. Fees are adjusted annually by the Board of Directors as part of the budget process, and shall be included in the Association's schedule of dues, assessments, charges and fees.
- **C.** Groups of more than 8 shall make prior arrangement with the General Manager to use tennis courts.

II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A. General
 - 1. Loud music is not allowed in or around the court areas.
 - 2. Pets are not permitted on the courts.
 - 3. Properly dispose of all trash.
 - 4. Members are responsible for the conduct of their children and guests.
 - 5. Profanity is prohibited.
 - 6. Proper shoes are worn on the courts.
 - 7. Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are prohibited. Reference 6.01, VII, D, 2.

B. All Tennis Courts

- 1. If others are waiting to play, limit play to 1 hour for singles and 1 1/2 hours for doubles.
- 2. Proper tennis or other soft-soled shoes shall be worn on all courts.
- 3. Tennis players are encouraged to wear proper tennis attire. Playing tennis without a shirt is not permitted.
- 4. Skateboards, roller skates, bicycles, tricycles and playing deck hockey are not permitted.
- 5. Unsupervised children under 12 are not permitted inside the fenced area when play is in progress.

C. Ashlawn Tennis Courts

 Application and/or registration are required for tennis members and tennis day use players.

- 2. Children 12 or under must be accompanied by an adult and may play without a fee.
- 3. Proper identification is required when using the tennis courts.
- 4. Close gates when leaving. Gates must be locked when courts are not in use.

III. ENFORCEMENT

Enforcement of these Rules and Regulations shall be the responsibility of the General Manager through the Chief of Police.
